Seatbelt Installation

Fitting lap-type seat belts for the front seat of an Amphicar is usually a snap: there are normally already two pairs of metal eyelets mounted on the floor, just behind the seat. So, all you have to do is get a pair of seatbelts <u>like these</u> from a joint like J.C. Whitney, attach them to the eyelets with a U-bolt or some other fastener, and you're good to go.

Of course, those REAR seat belts are a bit more of a challenge. What follows are just some photos so you can get a good clear look at one owner's elegant solution that even includes a handy storage bin. Thanks to Paul Lalewicz for the pics!
